



Position: Certified Occupational Therapy Assistant

The Occupational Therapy Assistant evaluates and treats residents and outpatients, under orders from a physician and Physical Therapist, through the use of a variety of therapeutic procedures and assistive devices intended to maximize functional potentials in all areas of an individual's life. The Occupational Therapy Assistant follows all State and Federal laws pertaining to healthcare delivery; follows the treatment plan as completed by the Occupational Therapist, completes treatments and documentation in a timely manner; works cooperatively with physicians, team members, and residents. The Occupational Therapy Assistant participates as a member of the interdisciplinary team providing support and information within the area of Occupational Therapy.

RESPONSIBILITIES & DUTIES

- Provides Therapy services established by the evaluating Occupational Therapist in the patient Plan of Care.
- Provides therapy services under the supervision of an OTR as determined by the Registered Therapist and in compliance with State and Federal guidelines.
- Carry out appropriate techniques according to identified goals and treatment programs.
- Administer standardized tests/measures as indicated by OTR.
- Consults with OTR regarding changes in treatment or condition in a timely manner.
- Appropriately and effectively completes documentation including daily notes and assisting the OTR to create progress notes and discharge summaries.
- Participate in coordination of services (including discharge planning), with health care team, physicians, parent/guardians, nurses, and appropriate others.
- Maintain effective communication between staff, health care team members, and family.
- Provides guidance to nursing and restorative nursing staff through education and training for continuation of care following discharge.
- Participates in provision of education and workshop opportunities on campus.
- Performs other duties as assigned.
